## MPs to study Eames/Bradley report

Plans to deal with the legacy of the Northern Ireland Troubles are to be examined by a group of Westminster MPs.

The Eames/Bradley report which contained the proposal to pay £12,000 to all those bereaved during the conflict, including the relatives of dead paramilitaries is to be scrutinised by the Northern Ireland Affairs Committee.

The committee, which is chaired by Conservative MP Sir Patrick Cormack, will carry out a "short inquiry" into the findings and will hear evidence from the men behind them later this month.

Former Church of Ireland Archbishop Robin Eames and ex vice chair of the Northern Ireland Policing Board Denis Bradley will travel to Westminster to meet committee members on February 25.

The publication of the report in Belfast last month sparked angry protests from relatives opposed to any suggestion that the families of terrorists could be given money.

The report also challenged politicians to take a lead role in the future at an annual day of reflection and reconciliation.

The total cost of implementing the proposals is estimated at around £300m.

The British and Irish Governments have promised to carefully consider the plan.
