Search for Disappeared Charlie Armstrong relocated

UTV can reveal that the search for Charlie Armstrong, one of the *Disappeared*, has been

moved to a new location. The major development was prompted by a tipoff.

UTV understands new information came on the back of a high-profile campaign aimed to finally find closure for families.

In an unprecedented move, Catholic priests made an appeal at Masses in January 2007. A confidential telephone number and postal address was also set up as a clear sign of the renewed efforts to finally end the torment of the families.



So far 4 of the 9 Disappeared victims the IRA admitted abducting, killing and secretly burying have been found.

The Provisionals have always denied involvement in Mr. Armstrong's murder and although it may not have been sanctioned, IRA members are believed to have been responsible.



This latest development comes after republican sources told UTV they were hopeful of progress in most of the cases of the Disappeared.

A detailed scientific investigation will be carried out on location over the next few weeks and specialist dogs will also be brought in before any decision is made to start digging.

The new site is just yards from where the remains of 2 other Disappeared victims - John McClory and Brian McKinney- were found.

It's now almost 27 years since Charlie Armstrong vanished from his South Armagh home.
