SDLP calls for parade review

The SDLP is calling on the Parades Commission to review their determinations on both the RIR homecoming parade and Sinn Fein's counter protest.

Fears are growing that violence will erupt in Belfast on Sunday.

Earlier, the Presbyterian Moderator Dr Donald Patton said the protest would be unhelpful and urged the Sinn Fein president to call off the demonstration

But Gerry Adams is defending his party`s plans and blaming the Secretary of State Shaun Woodward for the controversy.

Now the SDLP want the situation to be defused.

MLA Alex Attwood says steps need to be taken:

"There are things that could be done to take

the sting out of this issue so that both parade and protest can take place

Not whereby fears and anxieties are deepened but in a way that they are diminished.

Unionists have called for the public to support Sunday's homecoming parade organised by the Ministry of Defence for troops returning from Afghanistan.

But Mr. Adams defended plans for a Sinn Fein protest and said that while relatives had a right to welcome their loved ones home, the Secretary of State should have warned against a military march.

Mr. Adams said: "I hold the British Secretary of State responsible for the controversy that has arisen around the British Army`s military parade in Belfast on Sunday.

"While the British Ministry of Defence may be oblivious to the sensitivities involved, surely Shaun Woodward should have realised that Sunday's

A civic reception and a religious service would have provided families and supporters of the British Army with the opportunity to welcome back their

And while many Belfast citizens may not support such events there would have been little protestation."

There have been concerns expressed that while Sinn Fein says it plans to hold a peaceful protest, dissident republicans opposed to the peace process will hold their own demonstration.
