Carntall Rise, were remanded in custody until their trial.

Their case was the first to be brought to court by the Historical Enquiries Team (HET), a specialist unit set up to investigate unsolved murders from the Northern Ireland Troubles.

English (40) was gunned down at his home on the Ballyduff Estate, Newtownabbey, on Halloween night in 2000.

His killing was part of a row between rival UDA and UVF factions which claimed seven lives. English had been a member of a loyalist delegation which took part in talks at Stormont prior to the signing of the Good Friday Agreement in 1998.
