Collusion at heart of Eames' Falls talk

The Consultative Group on Northern Ireland's Past will address an audience in west Belfast today — with two members scheduled to speak in the heart of the Falls Road.

Retired Church of Ireland Archbishop Lord Eames — who is cochairman — and Presbyterian Minister Rev Lesley Carroll have been invited to speak at the annual meeting of the support group Relatives For Justice.

"They come from a different community with a different perspective," one of its directors Mark Thompson told the Belfast telegraph

"They have a wealth of experience on how the conflict has impacted on the unionist community," he added.

The Eames-Bradley Consultative Group will publish their report and recommendations early in the New Year.

On the question of the past and discovering the truth Mr Thompson said the issue of collusion is "at the heart of it"

The Consultative Group is expected to recommend a five-year Commission with Investigations and Information Recovery Units.

Today's event will be held in the Falls Library, west Belfast, with Lord Eames due to speak at lunchtime.


