	"The commissioner responded that she had been following this process closely," the minutes say.	
	"Since her role involves responding to complaints, she personally has to maintain a level of independence from the details of the process, but she regularly receives feedback from independent assessors on appointment competitions and has done so in this case. In respect of this feedback, she is aware that the competition has been very well run in line with OCPA guidance and that there has been a good level of interest and field of candidates."
