He also raised concerns about media coverage of his client before he was charged with the offence.

Mr King was remanded in custody to appear at the same court via video link on October 10th.

During the short hearing, Det Sgt Hamilton said officers were still pursuing one more suspect in relation to the killing.

Last week at Lisburn Magistrates' Court, Neil Hyde (28), from Princeton Avenue in Lurgan, and Nigel William Leckey (43), from Bowens Lane, also Lurgan, were also charged with the murder.

Mr King's brother, Robin Andrew King (43) appeared at the same court sitting charged with perverting the course of justice.

The prosecution claimed he had ordered the destruction or concealment of the car the police believe was involved in the crime.

All three were remanded in custody to appear at Craigavon Magistrates' Court via video link on October 10th.

Another man, Mark Kennedy (28), who is also from Lurgan, was charged with assisting offenders by allegedly destroying the same car.

He was released on bail and is also due to appear at Craigavon on the same date.

All this month's charges follow a major operation by a special police unit tasked to investigate historic killings linked to the Northern Ireland Troubles. - (*PA*)


