We wish to make formal application to address Dáil Eireann as a matter of urgency in order to submit certain suggestions which, if acted upon would materially help the people in the Six Counties who are campaigning for democracy and civil rights.

We therefore request you to place this before the Committee on Procedure and Privileges or any other appropriate body, as a matter of urgent national importance.

We propose to make ourselves available in Dublin at Leinster House on Wednesday May 14th at 3 p.m. If this date is not convenient we will make ourselves available on any suitable day this week or next.
