THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT HAS BEEN ISSUED BY THE GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SERVICES ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNMENT: -

THE GOVERNMENT AT ITS MEETING TO-DAY CONSIDERED THE GRAVE SITUATION IN NORTHERN IRELAND, WITH PARTICULAR REFERENCE TO THE SITUATION IN THE SOUTH ARMAGH AREA.

THE GOVERNMENT STRONGLY CONDEMNED YESTERDAY'S ATROCITIES INCLUDING THE MURDEROUS ATTACK ON A MEETING IN AN ORANGE HALL NEAR NEWTOWNHAMILTON AND EXPRESSED THEIR SYMPATHY WITH THE BEREAVED AND INJURED.

THE GOVERNMENT TOOK NOTE OF MR. MERLYN REES' STATEMENT OF TO-DAY AND WELCOMED THE INDICATION THAT THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT WOULD STEP UP SECURITY MEASURES IN THE SOUTH ARMAGH AREA. THE GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN CONCERNED FOR SOME TIME AT THE APPARENT LACK OF SECURITY IN THIS AREA, WHICH HAS COMPLICATED ITS OWN TASKOOF MAINTAINING SECURITY ALONG THIS SECTION OF THE BORDER. THE GOVERNMENT URGES ALL SECTIONS OF THE COMMUNITIES ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BORDER TO CO-OPERATE WITH THE SECURITY FORCES SO THAT THE PEOPLE RESPONSIBLE FOR THESE AND OTHER CRIMES MAY BE BROUGHT TO JUSTICE AND THE LIVES OF ALL CITIZENS MAY BE MORE EFFECTIVELY PROTECTED.
