HE HAD WITH HIM HIS PRINCIPAL PRIVATE SECRETARY, DOUGLAS JAMES AND BILL HARDING. I SPOKE IN THE SENSE OF THE FIRST PARAGRAPH OF YOUR C. 220. HIS FIRST REACTION WAS TO DEPLORE THE WAY IN WHICH THE BELFAST PRESS AND OUR OWN PAPERS ARE REPORTING THE PROBLEM. SOME MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE FEEDING THE PRESS IN A RATHER HYSTERICAL MANNER. ONE OF THE PEOPLE HE SEEMED TO HAVE IN MIND WAS PADDY DEVLIN. REES THEN WENT ON TO SAY THAT HE COULD NOT CARE LESS WHAT RULES OF PROCEDURE ARE ADOPTED. WHAT REALLY MATTERS IS WHAT COMES
OUT OF THE CONVENTION AT THE END OF THE DAY. IN THIS CONTEXT
HE CALLED MY ATTENTION TO ARTICLES 2(1) AND (2) OF THE NORTHERN
IRELAND ACT, 1974. REGARDLESS OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE THE REPORT
OR REPORTS TO EMERGE AT THE END OF THE DAY MUST MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 2. THERE CAN BE NO QUESTION OF MAJORITY AND MINORITY REPORTS NOR CAN THERE BE ANY QUESTION OF A REPORT WHICH IS ONE-SIDED. . IT IS CONCEIVABLE THAT AT THE END OF THE CONVENTION'S SIX MONTH PERIOD THERE COULD BE A SINGLE INTERIM REPORT. THE CONVENTION MAY NEED FURTHER TIME TO COMPLETE A FINAL REPORT BUT THIS TOO WILL HAVE TO BE A SINGLE REPORT TO FULFILL THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 2(1) AND (2). IF EITHER REPORT SHOULD FAIL TO CONFORM TO THESE REQUIREMENTS THEN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS WOULD HAVE TO BE SO INFORMED IN SPECIFIC TERMS.

CALLED THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S ATTENTION TO THE POWER HE HAS UNDER SECTION 11(2) OF SCHEDULE 2. DOUGLAS JAMES JUMPED IN THAT RESORT TO THIS POWER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE ONLY HAVE ON RESULT, NAMELY TO KILL THE CONVENTION
THE SECRETARY OF STATE REPEATED THE SUBSTANCE OF JANES'S INTERVENTION.

I HAVE RARELY SEEN THE SECRETARY OF STATE SO ANTI-SDLP. HE SAID THAT, IN A RECENT DIVISION IN THE HOUSE, GERRY FITT VOTED IN FAVOUR OF TROOPS OUT. THIS HE REGARDED AS A SCANDALOUS PERFORMANCE GIVEN FITT'S EFFORTS IN PRIVATE TO KEEP THE TROOPS THERE AND TO RETAIN IN DETENTION THE HARD CORE OF THE IRA.

THE ESSENTIAL MESSAGE I GOT FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE IS THAT HE IS STANDING ASIDE FROM THE CONVENTION OPERATION AND THAT HE HAS NO INTENTION OF INTERFERING. HIS ATTITUDE IS THAT THEY SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO ARGUE AS MUCH AS THEY WANT ADOUT RULES OF PROCEDURE AND OTHER MATTERS BECAUSE THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS ARE CLEARLY SET OUT IN THE LEGISLATION.

WE TOO SHOULD NOT BE OVER-INFLUENCED BY WHAT WE READ IN THE PRESS OR BY WHAT WE HEAR FROM THE SDLP. IF HE WERE NOW TO INTERVENE ON THE QUESTION OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE IT WOULD BE THE END OF THE CONVENTION - TO WHICH JAMES ADDED THE COMMENT ''AN END BROUGHT ABOUT AS A RESULT OF REPRESENTATIONS FROM DUBLIN''. RIGHTLY OR WRONGLY I TOOK THIS COMMENT BY JANES TO SUGGEST THAT CONTACT BETWEEN US AND THE SDLP ON THE MATTER COULD NOT REMAIN COME THE NEW

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ONE OF THE THINGS THAT DISTRUBED ME ABOUT THE DISCUSSION WAS THIS. WHEN I BROUGHT UP THE QUESTION OF THE NEED TO AVOID AN EROSION OF THE INFLUENCE OF THE CONVENTION CHAIRMAN, JANES CUT IN TO SAY THAT THE CHAIRMAN IS MERELY A SERVANT OF THE CONVENTION. I SAID THIS STRUCK ME AS AN EXTRAORDINARY REMARK. I SAID I WOULD EXPECT THE CHAIRMAN TO CHURE TO INSPIRE AND TO CONCIL LATE AS A MINIMUM. TO GUIDE, TO INSPIRE AND TO CONCILIATE AS A MINIMUM. REES AGREED BUT ADDED THAT HE MUST NEVERTHELESS BE THE SERVANT OF THE CONVENTION. I MIGHT ADD THAT AT A LUNCHEON LATER FOR OUR VISITING PARLIAMENTARIANS I TOOK THE OPPORTUNITY TO SAY TO BILL HARDING THAT I WAS ASTONISHED THAT DOUGLAS JANES SHOULD REGARD THE FUNCTION OF THE CHAIRMAN AS NO MORE THAN A RUBBER STAMP RESPONSIBILITY. BILL HARDING THOUGHT MY INTERPRETATION OF WHAT JAMES SAID AS BEING TOO NARROW.
