Government reaction to British White Paper  
of 2nd July, 1980.

*Mr. Murphy*

The proposals put forward in the White Paper are intended as a basis for further discussion and consultation on the future Government of Northern Ireland.

While the Government welcome discussion on possible solutions for the situation there, they consider and have made known their view that a solution cannot be found in the context of Northern Ireland alone, but must also take into account the reality of the political, social and economic relationship between the two parts of Ireland and be seen in the context of new and closer political co-operation between the Irish and British Governments. For this reason, they welcome the emphasis in the White Paper\* [not only on the need to heal divisions between the two sections of the Northern Ireland community but also on the interest both sections have in recognising the links that exist between Northern Ireland and this State, and on the unique relationship between the peoples of Britain and Ireland]]

[on the importance, as an aid to peace and reconciliation, of developing links between North and South in Ireland and between Ireland and Britain.]
