Further to the closure of the Lackey Bridge crossing
on Monday, 23 June, and as part of a number of coordinated
counter-terrorist measures in the NewtownButler area of

Fermanagh, the Government has decided on the advice of the
security forces to close a number of border crossings in
the section of the border south east of Newtown Butler bounded
on the east by the Newtown Butler - Magheraveely - Mill Brook Road,
and in the south by the Newtown Butler - Butlers Bridge Road.
The closures will begin on the morning of 1 July and will be
completed in the space of about two weeks.

RUC soundings indicate that there is likely to be little
local opposition to the closures and the Garda, who have been
consulted, have no objections. These further counter-terrorist
measures of which the border closures are only a part should
reduce tension and fear in the south east of Fermanagh and
reassure law abiding members of both communities in the area.
