GALLAGHER UUUJOSEP THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM AND NORTHERN IRELAND whenley 1. THE SECTION IN THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM RELATING TO NORTHERN IRELAND, THE TEXT OF WHICH HAS ALREADY BEEN SENT TO MS. ANDERSON IN ANGLO-IRISH SECTION (FURTHER COPY FAXED TO YOU) HAS GENERATED INTERST IN THE IRISH-AMERICAN COMMUNITY AND IN PARTICULAR HAS LED FIGURES SUCH AS NEW YORK REPUBLICAN CONGRESSMEN BEN GILMAN AND HAMILTON FISH (BOTH MEMBERS OF THE IRISH NATIONAL CAUCUS) AND PETER KING, COMPTROLLER OF NASSAU COUNTY IN NEW YORK AND A NORAID SUPPORTER, NOT ONLY TO ARGUE THAT THERE HAS BEEN A MAJOR CHANGE IN REPUBLICAN PARTY POLICY BUT ALSO TO CLAIM AUTHORSHIP OF THE PARAGRAPH IN QUESTION. THIS, WE ARE RELIABLY INFORMED, IS NOT THE CASE. THE PARAGRAPH IN QUESTION WAS DRAFTED BY A MEMBER OF THE TOURSELL AND LITER OF THE REFERENCE TO IRISH-AMERICAN GROUPS. THE FIRST SENTENCE READS ''WE SHARE A DEEP CONCERN FOR PEACE AND JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND AND CONDEMN ALL VIOLENCE AND TERRORISM IN THAT STRIFE TORN LAND'. THIS IS AN EXACT REPLICATION OF THE SENTENCE WHICH MADE UP THE 1984 REPUBLICAN PLATFORM ON NORTHERN IRELAND. (PETER KING RECENTLY ON RADIO HAS PUBLICLY LAID EMPHASIS ON THE REFERENCE TO ''PEACE AND JUSTICE", CLEARPY IN AN EFFORT TO ASSIMILATE IT TO THE IRA/NORAID USE OF ''PEACE WITH JUSTICE''.) THE SECOND SENTENCE STATING SUPPORT FOR THE PROCESS OF PEACE AND RECONCILIATION ESTABLISHED BY THE ANGLO-IRISH AGREEMENT REFLECTS STANDARD REPUBLICAN PARTY VIEWS. THE FINAL CLAUSE, WHICH REFERS TO THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF ''NEW INVESTMENT AND ECONOMIC RECONSTRUCTION IN NORTHERN IRELAND ON THE BASIS OF STRICT EQUAL OF OPPORTUNITY AND NON-DISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT' WAS, INSPIRED BY FORMULATIONS SETTING OUT THE OBJECTIVES OF THE INTERNATIONAL FUND FOR IRELAND. IT DOES NOT, WE ARE INFORMED, IMPLY ANY CHANGE OF APPROACH ON THE MACBRIDE PRINCIPLES. (THE IRISH VOICE NEWSPAPER IN NEW YORK RECENTLY LINKED THIS PHOASE TO SUCH A CHANGE OF APPROACH) PHRASE TO SUCH A CHANGE OF APPROACH).

- 3. IT IS WORTH NOTING THAT THE IRISH PEOPLE, THE PRO-IRA
 NEWSPAPER BASED IN NEW YORK, REPORTED ON 20 AUGUST THAT A
 LETTER OF 28 JUNE REQUESTING A JOINT MEETING WITH BUSH HAD BEEN
 NT TO THE VICE-PRESIDENT BY A DOZEN OR SO IRISH—
 AMERICAN GROUPS. WE UNDERSTAND FROM THE REPUBLICAN PARTY
 THE CO-SIGNATORIES WERE AS FOLLOWS: JOHN DEARIE,
 ASSEMBLYMAN FOR THE BRONX: JOHN FINUCANE, NATIONAL PRESIDENT
 AMERICAN IRELAND POLITICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE, CODY MCCONE,
 PRESIDENT BREHON LAW SOCIETY OF NEW YORK, THOMAS CONNAUGHTON,
 PRESIDENT GRAND COUNCIL OF EMERALD SOCIETIES: SEAN MINIHANE,
 NATIONAL CHAIRMAN IIRM: KATHLEEN HOLMES, CHAIRWOMAN AMERICAN
 IRISH CONGRESS: FR. SEAN MCMANUS, IRISH NATIONAL CAUCUS:
 NICK MURPHY OF THE AOH: JOHN LAWE, TRANSPORTATION WORKERS
 UNION: MARTIN GALVIN: FRANK FEIGHERY, CHAIRMAN UNITED
 IRISH COUNTIES ASSOCIATION: MARY HOLT MOORE, COUNCIL OF GAELIC
 SOCIETIES AND MICHAEL QUINN OF THE WESTCHESTER IRISH
 COMMITTEE. THE CO-SIGNATORIES PUT FORWARD A SIX POINT
 AGENDA FOR DISCUSSION AND SAID THEY WERE TOTALLY FLEXIBLE
 AS TO TIME AND PLACE. THE SIX ITEMS WERE:
 - 1. A U.S. ENVOY TO NORTHERN IRELAND.
 - 2. FEDERAL LEGISLATION ON THE MACBRIDE PRINCIPLES.

4. VISA POLICIES ''AS REGARDS IRISH ELECTED OFFICIALS''.

5. THE U.S. - U.K. EXTRADITION TREATY.

6. US CONTRIBUTION TO THE INTERNATIONAL FUND FOR IRELAND.

SOME OF THESE OF COURSE ARE FAMILIAR ITEMS ON THE NORAID/ IRISH NATIONAL CAUCUS/AOH SHOPPING LIST.

- THE LETTER OF 28 JUNE WAS RESPONDED TO IN EARLY AUGUST I.E.

 BEFORE THE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION, BY A JUNIOR VICE
 PRESIDENTIAL AIDE, TURNING DOWN THE REQUEST FOR A MEETING.

 THIS PROMPTED A VIGOROUS DENOUNCIATION OF THE BUSH
 CAMPAIGN BY THE ''IRISH PEOPLE''. WHAT IS INTRIGUING
 HOWEVER IS THAT ON 18 AUGUST, I.E. AFTER THE PUBLICATION
 OF THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM, WE UNDERSTAND THAT BUSH RECEIVED
 A PHONE CALL FROM CARDINAL LAW OF BOSTON WHO TOLD THE VICE—
 PRESIDENT THAT HE HAD BEEN ASKED BY CARDINAL O'CONNOR
 TO REQUEST THE VICE—PRESIDENT TO REVIEW THE EARLIER DECISION
 TURNING DOWN THE REQUEST FOR A MEETING. BUSH WAS UNFAMILIAR WITH
 THE CASE AND TOLD HIS STAFF THAT CARDINAL LAW MENTIONED TO
 HIM THAT HE THOUGHT FR. MCMANUS WAS ''CONTROVERSIAL''. WE
 UNDERSTAND THAT BUSH HAS ASKED HIS STAFF TO LOOK INTO THE
 MATTER AND PREPARE A WRITTEN RESPONE TO CARDINAL O'CONNOR ON
 THE ISSUE. (IN THE EVENT HOWEVER THE REPLY MAY GO TO
 CARDINAL LAW AS BUSH'S PRIMARY INTERLOCUTOR). WE ALSO
 UNDERSTAND THAT THE RESPONSE IS LIKELY TO BE A POLITE
 REFUSAL TO HAVE SUCH A MEETING.
- ON THE NOVELTY, AS THEY SEE IT OF THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM'S EXTENSIVE REFERENCE TO IRELAND, SIDE BY SIDE WITH AN ARTICLE REPORTING ON DEARIE'S STRICTURES OF MR. BUSH FOR HIS FAILURE SO FAR TO MEET WITH THE DELEGATION DESCRIBED ABOVE.
- 6. WE UNDERSTAND THAT THERE IS SOME RESENTMENT IN THE BUSH CAMPAIGN AT THE CLAIMS MADE BY CONGRESSMEN GILMAN, AND HAMILTON FISH, AND PETER KING THAT THEY WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SHAPING OF THE PLATFORM. CLEARLY AT SOME STAGE IT

WILL BECOME CLEAR THAT THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM DOES NOT AMOUNT TO A CHANGE IN REPUBLICAN THINKING ON NORTHERN IRELAND AND IT WILL BE INTERESTING TO SEE THE REACTION OF THE RELEVANT IRISH-AMERICAN GROUPS IN THE NEW YORK AREA.
