REACTION TO PRIME MINISTER'S COMMENTS ON THE IRISH POTATO FAMINE

1. I thought it might be worth recording that Frank Sheridan, the Irish Consul General here, told me on 6 June that he had been amazed at the reaction in Chicago to the Prime Minister's remarks on the Irish Potato Famine. He said that members of the Irish community had stopped him in the street to say what a bold move it was and what a significant effect it was likely to have on the Peace Talks. Frank then added that in his view, if the British Government could now bring itself to make a similar statement about "Bloody Sunday", two of the major tensions in UK-Irish relations would have been much relaxed. There was, said Frank, a case to answer on Bloody Sunday.
