NORTHERN IRELAND MEMORIAL FUND

As a result of recent consultation with victims/survivor groups the Memorial Fund have made some changes to the schemes which they offer.

The <u>Small Grant Scheme</u> which provides household grants of up to £500 for those experiencing financial difficulties will close on <u>30th June 2005</u>.. Therefore I encourage anyone who has not yet received a small grant to consider applying before the deadline.

<u>The Short Break Scheme</u> has been reopened by the Fund to those who had only received one short break in the past, these applicants will be granted one further short break from the Fund. The Short Break Scheme gives individuals and families that have been affected by the Troubles short breaks throughout the British Isles. The Scheme also offers respite care breaks.

<u>Help for the Elderly</u> - On 1st December 2004 the Fund introduced a winter assistance grant to help the over 60's. The Grant is designed to help victims over 60 with additional costs associated with the winter months. A grant of $\pounds 150$ is available to successful applicants.

Application forms for all of the above can be obtained from the OSSHG office. Please also note that Sharon can assist with the completion of forms for anyone who requires assistance.

Internal Funds

The Fund has decided with immediate effect to pay the families of those killed in internal funds.

DAAD Deaths

The Fund has decided to pay with immediate effect to pay the families of those killed by DAAD.

Please note that the Memorial Fund is now asking bereaved victims for documentation as proof of their relationship to the deceased due to audit requirements. For guidance as to acceptable forms of documentation contact Sharon at Support Office.

<u>SUPPORT GROUP ARCHIVE PROJECT UP AND RUNNING!</u> <u>IT COURES AVAILABLE</u>

The OSSHG archive project is well underway. Group members and volunteers are currently completing their CLAIT and EDCL training courses, and a team building day is planned for **Saturday 19th February, 2005 from 9.30—5.00pm.**



The team building day will afford all those involved in the archive project the opportunity to meet one another.
