Backs tribunal call

**SDLP leader supports relatives` cause**

SDLP leader Mark Durkan today backed demands for an independent inquiry into the deaths of 11 people killed during the introduction of internment 37 years ago.

He claimed the tribunal would be the only proper tribute to their families and now plans to table a motion at the Northern Ireland Assembly calling for a public apology from the British government.

Among the 11 who died were a Catholic priest and a mother of eight, shot by soldiers in Ballymurphy, west Belfast, over a three-day period in August 1971, when hundreds of men were arrested across Northern Ireland and detained without trial.

Mr Durkan pledged his support for the inquiry after meeting the victims` families at Stormont.
