Omagh atrocity

Omagh civil action resumes in Dublin

A landmark civic court case against five men accused of carrying out the Omagh bomb reopens in Dublin today.

This is the first time evidence from a Northern Ireland case is heard in the Republic.

More than 50 gardai have been summonsed to testify in the District Court in Dublin.

When the case first sat two weeks ago, barristers had planned to take evidence from the first 29 officers.

However, just 7 gardai took the witness box before the case was adjourned.

Lawyers for the families are now expected to apply for an extension to continue sitting in Dublin.

The men are believed to be responsible for the Real IRA blast in August 1998 which killed 29 people.

Alleged Real IRA leader Michael McEvitt, Liam Campbell, Colm Murphy, Seamus McKenna and Seamus Daly all deny any involvement in the bomb attack.
