

I still live with Ulster bomb horror - Local & National - News - Belfast Telegraph

Community Telegraph	 "It was a horrifying scene. "There was human debris everywhere - in trees, on the grass verge and in the water. "Mostly unidentifiable lumps of red flesh, but among them torsos, limbs, heads, hands and ears. I have seen the effect of bombs before but never carnage on this scale. All that was left of the driver of the rear lorry was his pelvis, welded to the seat by the intense heat." General Sir Mike writes: "In such circumstances your emotions shut down and training takes over." He added: "It stayed light late that warm summer evening. It seemed unbelievable that something so terrible could have happened in such a beautiful spot. "One of the divers from the Royal Engineers asked me quietly to come and look at something he'd found in the water. "It was a human face blown clear of the man's skull. The line of a moustache was still visible. The diver asked if I recognised the man. I felt a shiver of horror. 'Of course I do,' I said in a shaky voice. 'He's a good friend of mine." The man was Major Fursman. Another soldier, David Blair, was identified only by the crown and the star of his rank on his epaulette. "I still have ugly pictures in my head from that terrible day. Once you've seen such appalling sights you can't close your mind to them," he writes. 	Are you missing out on opportunities?
