

A shortlist was handed to Mr Paisley and Mr McGuinness shortly after they took up office on May 8. They later indicated they would make a decision about the job by early July, but no announcement was made.

Mr Paisley was the driving force behind the nomination of the interim Victims' Commissioner by the NIO two years ago - a post that the High Court later declared an illegal political favour to the DUP.
