	They told the Assembly they would appoint by July, but then announced in October that they were re- advertising the post to attract more candidates. They said they would appoint by the end of December from a combined pool, including the six original shortlisted candidates but one - former Alliance deputy leader Seamus Close - publicly withdrew.
