Despite this, the British army's report makes no reference to Saville. Neither does it conclude, as many strongly believe, on thu that it was wrong to send a crack frontline regiment to deal with a civilian protest march. John Kelly, whose brother Michael (17) was one of those killed, said he was shocked at the lack of value placed on the life of his brother and the other victims. "They said the biggest lesson was the use of vehicles; they are not taking into account the loss of human life," he said. "The deaths on Bloody Sunday were totally immaterial; it is clear the people of Derry do not count to the British army."
