Sinn Fein youth wing condemned - Wells

South Down DUP Assembly Member Jim Wells has described as disgusting the agenda for the Sinn Fein youth wing conference to be held in Newcastle which includes a trip to the Narrow Water site where some 18 soldiers were murdered by IRA criminals. The press statement issued by the group also made reference to the colour of Newcastle Orange Hall being changed for the weekend. Jim Wells MLA said:

"Everyone knows that the Sinn Fein Youth Wing is an embarrassment to their more senior colleagues: this after all is the group whose contribution to delivering a united Ireland has been to run around the countryside painting



post boxes green. On this occasion however they have crossed the line from crankish foolishness to gratuitously offensive behaviour.

The Warrenpoint ambush perpetrated by criminals claimed the lives of some 18 soldiers. On the same day IRA murderers killed Lord Mountbatten, an elderly gentleman holidaying in the Republic of Ireland as he had done for many years. Despite the green-tinted, "Wind that shakes the Barley" interpretation of history that the Sinn Fein youth wing may possess the fact remains that they are attempting to glorify what was a cold-hearted and heinous act of murder carried out by wicked terrorists.
